## PROFILE

**W. CARL JACKSON** has assumed the position of dean, University Libraries at Indiana University effective the first of this year.

Mr. Jackson comes to Indiana after seven years as director of libraries at Penn State. While there, he doubled the book collections, worked for and achieved faculty status for librarians, and oversaw the building of a dozen new libraries on various campuses. In 1972, he received the Distinguished Service Award for the Pennsylvania Library Association. Prior to Penn State he worked at the Universities of Tennessee, Iowa, Minnesota, and Colorado.

At Indiana Mr. Jackson intends to focus particularly on greater staff participation in policy making, along with developing the recently achieved academic status there. At the same time, he will try to develop the concept of a unified "system" at the multicampus university, and pay particular attention to automation plans.

Mr. Jackson replaces Dr. Robert A. Miller, who retired from administration to teach at Indiana's Graduate Library School.

Beginning in 1834, Karl Proske collected, copied, and transcribed thousands of sacred compositions by the masters of classical polyphony. His magnificent library, which to this day remains a rich quarry for scholars, forms the basis of these two sets of volumes, which contain transcriptions of a great number of works by such composers as Palestrina, Lassus, Vittoria, Andrea Gabrieli, Fux, Vecchi, and Alessandro Scarlatti—many of them unavailable in any other modern transcription. *Musica divina* and *Selectus novus missarum* also contain Proske's many valuable prefaces, annotations, and biographical notes.

The reprint edition includes a valuable new introduction by Paul Henry Lang, editor of *Musical Quarterly* and author of *Music in Western Civilization*.

This collection, subtitled "opera varia (saecul. XV, XVI, XVII et XVIII); diligenter excerpta, accurate revisa, sedulo concinnata," was edited by Felipe Pedrell, the founder of modern Spanish musical scholarship. The volumes contain modern transcriptions of a selection of sacred compositions of important Spanish composers, together with scholarly biographical, textual, and bibliographical notes in Spanish, with facing page translations into French. Composers treated, among others, are Morales, Guerrero, Pérez, and à Cabezon.

The collection is extensively cited as a source in Gustave Reese's *Music in the Renaissance*.
