PROFILE

Effective November 1 of last year, Joseph H. Treyz became director of libraries at the University of Wisconsin-Madison replacing

Louis Kaplan who resigned to teach in the University of Wisconsin's library school.

Mr. Treyz was formerly assistant director of libraries at the University of Michigan, a position he held from 1965 to his appointment at Wisconsin. While there he played a major role in the reorganization of technical services, a field in which

he has published widely. His contributions to technical services were recognized in 1970 when he was awarded the Melvil Dewey Award.

Before moving to Michigan, he was head of the program that selected, acquired, and processed the basic collections for the University of California's new campuses in Irvine, Santa Cruz, and San Diego. The magnitude of this accomplishment might best be judged if one scans *Books for College Libraries*, a volume that he coedited along with Melvin Voight.

His professional activities have included memberships in state and regional associations as well as numerous chairmanships of ALA,

RTSD, and ACRL committees. He is currently a councilor for ALA and a member of the RTSD Board of Directors.

Mr. Treyz's wide experience in large academic libraries will prove to be a valuable asset in the University of Wisconsin-Madison setting.
